In response to the evolving post-COVID educational landscape, Bethel Bible College of the Caribbean–Jamaica recognized the importance of enhancing educational offerings through technology. The implementation of our learning management system, BethelONLINE, in 2019 marked the start of this journey, opening new possibilities.

Recently, we secured access to the **Online Publications and Academic Library (OPAL) Network** via the *William G. Squires Library* at Lee University and Pentecostal Theological Seminary in the United States of America. Access to this online library network gives students, staff, and faculty a vast collection of electronic resources at their fingertips. Users can now explore databases like Academic Search Complete, ATLA with Serials, and JSTOR, covering a wide range of academic disciplines specifically chosen to support theological education and ministerial development.

Additionally, we are also implementing **FACTS SIS** - a state-of-the-art student information and school management system designed to streamline our administrative and academic processes and improve communication across the college.

These developments are significant steps forward on our journey of academic and spiritual growth. We thank God for these opportunities to enhance our educational environment and look forward to how they will enrich our great institution.


