PROFILE OF GUEST SPEAKER

REV. CHRISTINE GOODEN-BENGUCHE

Rev. Christine Gooden-Benguche’s journey in ministry and service began with her training as a teacher at Moneague Teachers’ College, where she earned a Diploma in Teaching. Her passion for faith and education led her to the United Theological College of the West Indies, where she furthered her theological education, completing a Diploma in Ministry, a Bachelor’s Degree in Theology, and a Master’s Degree in Mission Studies.

Her ministry work has spanned numerous communities in Jamaica, including Spanish Town, May Pen, Ocho Rios, Western St. Andrew, Grateful Hill, Annotto Bay, and Mt. Fletcher in the hills of St. Andrew. She also extended her service beyond Jamaica, working in the Friendship Circuit in Guyana. Today, she serves as the President and Bishop of the Methodist Church in Jamaica, a role that reflects her deep commitment to spiritual leadership and community support.

Rev. Gooden-Benguche’s contributions have been vast and impactful, reflecting her dedication to both ministry and service. For nearly a decade, she held the position of Secretary for the Jamaica Methodist District Conference and later became the Ministerial Training Secretary, a role she fulfilled for seven years. Her voice reaches countless individuals through the Methodist radio program Light For Our Path, which she coordinates and hosts on RJR each Sunday morning at 5:45 a.m.. Additionally, she has been a familiar presence on MTM television, where she hosts Methodist Voices in Word and Song and Methodist Connexion.

Her commitment to education and community service is evident in her involvement with several boards of management. She chairs the boards of Morant Bay and York Castle High Schools and has served on the board of the EXED Complex. In the past, she chaired the boards of various primary and junior high schools. Rev. Gooden-Benguche also contributes her expertise to the Jamaica National Children’s Home and has held leadership roles within the Jamaica Council of Churches, where she currently serves as President. Her dedication extends to the planning of national and religious services, where she currently chairs the Committee for Planning National and Religious Services (CPNRS) and serves as a member of the CPNRS-JCDC Committee. Her involvement with the Ecumenical Education Committee and the Sons of the Father Movement further demonstrates her commitment to nurturing both faith and education in the community.

Rev. Christine Gooden-Benguche’s service and leadership have left an enduring impact across Jamaica and beyond, exemplifying her devotion to faith, education, and the Church’s mission.
